#### Rabbi's Message by Rabbi Jonathan Siger

**BACK TO SHUL TIME!** 



It is highly probable that you will read this in the midst of "back-to-school" season. Stores will advertise, circulars will circulate and flyers will abound telling us where to go and what to buy so that our students will be prepared to return to their academic pursuits.

In the Jewish world, it means the High Holidays are coming. Traditions from many different communities guide us in how to prepare for the spiritual work that we are called to do. One of the most widely observed is a special, late-night service known as 'selichot'.

"Selichot" means "Pardons" in Hebrew. An early collection of teachings called the "Machzor Vitry" describes the practice thus: "It is a custom to begin on the Saturday night before Rosh Hashanah to rise early to the synagogue, before the sun rises, and beg for mercy."

By joining in the communal recitations of psalms and confessional prayers, an individual is able to ease into the season of repentance and self-reflection. It's a bit like beginning to train for a marathon by taking walks, or, at the least, stretching.

In some communities, they gather in the early hours of the morning, in the pre-dawn darkness. In others, we gather late in the evening.

We will host our Selichot service this year on the evening of Saturday, September 5th, at 10 p.m. Silence, meditation and music all help make this one of the most beautiful and memorable services of the year.

Our Selichot is just one of the many programs and worship experiences I look forward to sharing with you as we prepare to go "back to shul".



## About the High Holy Days

Rosh HaShanah (literally, "Head of the Year") is the Jewish New Year, which marks the beginning of a 10-day period of prayer, self-examination and repentance. This period, known as the Yamim Noraim (Days of Awe or High Holy Days), is widely observed by Jews throughout the world, many with prayer and reflection in a synagogue. There also are several holiday rituals observed at home.

Rosh HaShanah is celebrated on the first day of the Hebrew month of *Tishrei*, which—because of differences in the solar and lunar calendar—corresponds to September or October on the secular calendar. Customs associated with the holiday include sounding the shofar, eating a






round challah, and tasting apples and honey to represent a sweet New Year.

Yom Kippur means "Day of Atonement" and refers to the annual Jewish observance of fasting, prayer and repentance. Part of the High Holidays, which also includes Rosh HaShanah, Yom Kippur is considered the holiest day on the Jewish calendar. In three separate passages in the Torah, the Jewish people are told, "the tenth day of the seventh month is the Day of Atonement. It shall be a sacred occasion for you: You shall practice self-denial."(Leviticus 23:27). Fasting is seen as fulfilling this biblical commandment. The Yom Kippur fast also enables us to put aside our physical desires to concentrate on our spiritual needs through prayer, repentance and selfimprovement.

Yom Kippur is the moment in Jewish time when we dedicate our mind, body, and soul to reconciliation with God, our fellow human beings, and ourselves. We are commanded to turn to those whom we have wronged first, acknowledging our sins and the pain we might have caused. At the same time, we must be willing to forgive and to let go of certain offenses and the feelings of resentment they provoked in us. On this journey we are both seekers and givers of pardon. Only then can we turn to God and ask for forgiveness: "And for all these. God of forgiveness, forgive us, pardon us, and grant us atonement."

Sukkot, a Hebrew word meaning "booths" or "huts," refers to the Jewish festival of giving thanks for the fall harvest. It also commemorates the 40 years of Jewish wandering in the desert after the giving of the Torah atop Mt. Sinai. Sukkot is celebrated five days after Yom Kippur on the 15th of the month of Tishrei, and is marked by

One, which takes the commandment to dwell in booths literally, is to erect a *sukkah*, a small, temporary booth or hut. Sukkot (in this case, the plural of *sukkah*) are commonly used during the seven-day festival for eating, entertaining and even for sleeping.

Sukkot also called Z'man Simchateinu (Season of Our Rejoicing), is the only festival associated with an explicit commandment to rejoice. A final name for Sukkot is Chag HaAsif, (Festival of the Ingathering), representing a time to give thanks for the bounty of the earth during the fall harvest.

#### **GREETINGS**

Rosh Hashanah is the Jewish New Year and is a major holiday on the Jewish calendar. Wishing your Jewish friends a "Happy New Year" is as easy as saying "L'Shana Tova," which means "For a Good Year" in Hebrew. Rosh Hashanah is not traditionally a gift-giving holiday but if you are invited to someone's home and want to bring something, sweet foods make thoughtful Rosh Hashanah gifts.

Yom Kippur is the Jewish Day of Atonement and is considered the holiest and most solemn day on the Jewish calendar. Because Yom Kippur is a fast day, it is appropriate to wish your Jewish friends an "Easy Fast" on Yom Kippur, or in Hebrew "Tzom Kal." The traditional Yom Kippur greeting is "G'mar Hatimah Tovah" or "May You Be Sealed for a Good Year (in the Book of Life)." This reflects the Jewish view of Yom Kippur as the day when God seals our fates (determined by our actions) for the upcoming year in the Books of Life or Death. The entire ten Days of Awe from Rosh Hashanah through Yom Kippur are viewed as the beginning of the New Year, so you may also still wish your Jewish friends a "Happy New Year" or "L'Shana Tovah" on Yom Kippur. In structuring our security protocols, we received extensive input and guidance from Homeland Security, Anti-Defamation League, the URJ and several other congregations. **We need your cooperation to make this happen.** 

We are trying to be responsive and flexible regarding the needs of our Congregants while providing a safe and secure environment. Please make sure to give advance notice and several dates when arranging for access.

- 1) No one is allowed in the building alone, unless authorized (This is for their protection as well as ours)
- 2) All building opening requests go to Security@cjcn.org or call 713-724-6261
- 3) Non-members are not to be on premises without appropriate personnel



- 4) Constables (paid) are required when any one of the following 3 take place:
  - a) Event with 50 or more people
  - b) Event with alcohol
  - c) Event that is open to public and non-members are welcomed (This does not apply if you are a member and are bringing a guest)

IE: The Maj Jongg tournament needed a constable, but a Bar/Bat does not. Why? The tournament was publicly and opened to the public. Bar/Bat attendees are invited and there is a contract making the party" responsible for the people and the premises. On Friday evenings, we have at least 1 of our own Security committee on "duty".
