Here we are at the time of year when people seek togetherness, express gratitude, and pray for a world at peace. At the same time, partisan, reactionary politics and the fallout from a divisive and brutal campaign continues to affect this congregation, as it does every Jewish community across this nation and around the world. I speak, of course, of the campaign of the Maccabees against the Greeks.

You may have noticed that there is no mention of the Maccabees in the Hebrew Bible. While there were books written about them, they were not included in the official collection of literature that became the Tanakh (Torah, Prophets, and Writings). There are several good reasons for this, including the fact that they were written in, ironically enough, Greek. There is also the consideration that the rabbis did not like the violence or the corruption that the Maccabee leaders brought to the nation after they took power.

These were not problems to the early church, however, and the Catholics preserved the Books of Maccabees along with many other Jewish texts as part of the "apocrypha". These are extracanonical books and additions. I like to compare them to the 'deleted scenes' or 'alternate endings' sometimes included on DVDs of movies.





My wife Sallie, of blessed memory, and I joined JCN (that was the name back then) in 1982. Louetta was only a couple of lanes, Kroger was in 24 hour fitness, Randall's was in Goodwill, and Strack Farms was about the only place to grab dinner before services. I'll always remember our first Shabbat; it was Purim and we were meeting across the street in the church; our building was under construction. I was sure the custodians must have thought we were all nuts! So we were not a founding family, but we didn't miss it by much.

My family grew in the subsequent years as Jeff and then Rachel came on to the scene and attended the school through Confirmation. He lives on the other side of town now but you can still see Rachel from time to time..... She's the other violin in the Bayit Band. At the temple we added the social hall followed by the school and finally the sanctuary. Sallie was active in Sisterhood I served on the Board and the Executive Committee a few times during those years.

I started playing the violin as a kid and was classically trained through college when you might say I fell off that wagon, first into bluegrass and then into rock and jazz (once they figured out how to electrify violins). I currently play in bars and restaurants around the area with a few different groups. I've been the fiddler on your roof playing Kol Nidre since a couple years before the sanctuary, so that must be about 30 years. Talk about a steady gig! CJCN has been part of my family for 35 years, and I am looking forward to many more.
